2. Italy: \$85.13 million (17.9%)

3. Türkiye: \$74.59 million (15.7%)

4. Pakistan: \$33.37 million (7%)

5. Tunisia: \$33.32 million (7%)

6. Germany: \$11.69 million (2.5%)

7. China: \$11.55 million (2.4%)

8. Algeria: \$8.75 million (1.8%)

Egypt's Cotton Export Performance (2024–25)

Export Value & Global Position

- Egypt's cotton exports in calendar 2024 were valued at approximately \$475.3 million, representing 0.9% of global cotton export value.
- Egypt ranks around 15th among global <u>cotton exporters</u> in 2024 by value, behind China, India, the US, Brazil, etc.
- Compared to 2023's exports, Egypt experienced a 9.1% year-on-year drop in value.

Export Volume Outlook

- In marketing year (MY) 2024/25 (August 2024–July 2025), USDA forecasts Egyptian cotton exports at 184,000 480-lb bales, down by 66,000 bales from MY 2023/24.
- Export commitments as of early March 2025 totaled only 23,227.5 MT (106,684 bales) for the season, 35% lower than the prior year's pace.
- Forecast projections suggest a continued decline in exports: a 4.9% drop from 2024 to 2025, followed by further declines through 2028, with exports expected to fall from 265k to 213k bales.

Export Destinations & Product Breakdown

- Detailed bilateral export data by country for "prepared cotton" in 2023 shows small values (Egypt exports \$1.24M mainly to Sudan, Spain, Saudi Arabia).
- Cotton yarn (HS 5205 category), derived from Egyptian cotton, saw top export destinations in 2023: Italy (36% US\$43M), Germany (8.48% 10.1M), Turkey (8.3%), Austria, and the Czech Republic.
- In the period August–November 2024, Egypt's total cotton yarn exports reached 7,603 MT, up 72% year-on-year; cotton fabric exports (HS 5208/5209) were 15,106 MT, up 25%.

Supply & Demand Context

- Domestic production has stagnated: from 68,687 tons (≈141,863 bales) in crop year 2023/24 to a slightly higher expectation in 2024/25, but most output is used domestically rather than exported.
- Consumption skyrocketed in MY 2024/25 to approximately 750,000 bales, the highest in 14 years, driven by massive textile investments and rising domestic milling demand.
- To meet demand, imports surged to a record 675,000 bales, mainly from Greece (>50%), with Brazil rapidly expanding its share, while U.S. cotton shipments declined drastically to under 1,000 bales.

Why the Export Decline – Analysis

1. Domestic Use First

Egypt's aggressive push to revive its textile industry, including more than \$1 billion public investment into upgrading mills in Mahalla El-Kobra, means domestically grown Egyptian cotton is largely retained for local processing and export of textiles rather than raw cotton.

2. High Government Prices

Government-set floor prices made domestic cotton overpriced relative to global markets, limiting sales to foreign buyers and resulting in unsold stocks that state-owned enterprises are absorbing.

3. Global Demand Softness

Global cotton trade dipped slightly in 2024 (-1.4%), and major exporters like the U.S. and Australia also saw declines in export volume; Egypt was not immune to these broader market pressures.

- Exports likely shrink further: projections show a steady decline through 2028 as domestic processing takes priority and raw cotton exports become increasingly marginal.
- Textile-led strategy: Egypt is shifting from a raw cotton exporter to a regional textile hub, adding capacity and focusing on value-added downstream products.
- Markets rebalancing: rising consumption and competitiveness of suppliers like Brazil and Greece mean Egyptian cotton is increasingly reserved for local use, not global sale.

Egypt's export trajectory during the 2024–25 cycle illustrates a strategic shift: away from raw cotton exports and toward domestic textile-led utilization. As consumption rises to record highs, bolstered by government and foreign investment, Egyptian cotton exports are declining, even as overall cotton yarn and fabric exports grow, as per the reports of the Egyptian Ministry of Trade & Industry. India, China, the U.S., and Brazil continue to dominate the global cotton trade, but Egypt is reshaping its role, from a raw cotton supplier to a textile production center.
